7. Narrative:

While reviewing this case with Lieutenant J. G. Bryant on the morning of 10/10/95, it was determined that this residence, 2104 Brandon Station Court, had been burglarized, a crime reported in case #950207012.

I reviewed this case, and determined that two suspects had been arrested, Harold Dean Styles, II, and Paul David Hunt, II.

Styles was currently confined in Jail #1, and I had him brought to be interviewed in CID.

Styles has recently received an active sentence for convictions arising out of burglaries including 950207012, and is awaiting transportation to a prison facility to serve his sentence.

Styles says that he went into this house alone, and that he took only those items which he could easily carry.

Of the items listed on the initial report as being stolen, Styles says that he did not take an Olympus Camera which was reported. Styles says that he is somewhat of a photography enthusiast, and would have taken and kept the camera if he had seen it. Styles also says that he did not take the Nintendo game reported stolen. Styles recalls picking it up and looking at it, but says that it had too many wires wrapped around it, and he did not want to waste the time necessary to untangle it. Styles says that he took a Nintendo cartridge box, but found later that it did not contain a game cartridge. Styles also says that he did not take any CD's, nor did he recall taking any coins/change from the residence.
