I Theodore M. Kimble am presently trying to appeal my case. I'm not sure how to file my appeal but am seeking the information as I write.

Around the first week of February I signed a plea agreement, Pleading guilty to charges I'm not guilty of. I felt my life threatened and I was on medication. A few weeks later it was brought to my attention that I might retract my plea. On February 25, 1999 I wrote the Clerk of Superior Court and the judge. I requested to retract my plea. On March 4, 1999 representing myself, I stood before superior court Judge Peter McHugh in Guilford County. I asked to withdraw my plea and go to trial, but was denied. Arguments were heard that afternoon and the following morning. I was then sentenced. I've read part of the North Carolina Post Conviction Remedies. It states 3 unusual reasons a defendant who pleads guilty may get a new trial. Number 2 states, "A defendant tried to retract his plea, but was denied by the Superior Court Judge." It goes on to say there's a 10 day time limit to file the appeal, I'm writing you to beat the dead line. Please note my ^{address} for appeal.
